The Boyce Camerata was founded in 2019 by Yassine Taoudi-Benchekroun and Adam Heron to coincide with the 240th anniversary since the death of British composer William Boyce.

The ensemble boasts an array of talented young musicians, all of whom hail from the major London conservatoires and artistic institutions, including the Royal Academy of Music, Royal College of Music, Guildhall School of Music & Drama and Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music & Dance. Having already appeared at venues such as St Maryat-Hill in the City of London, The Boyce Camerata has been fortunate to collaborate with esteemed soloists such as the pianist Aïda Lahlou, who made her London concerto debut with the ensemble during the year of its founding.

This current tour includes a selection of much loved classics, including William Boyce's popular First Symphony, as well as the demanding and dramatic Piano Concerto No. 20 by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

Adam Heron

Acclaimed by The Sunday Times for the verve and spirit of his performances, Adam Heron is swiftly earning a reputation as one of



the most innovative pianists of his generation. Winner of the 2020 Harriet Cohen Bach Prize, Adam rose to prominence following his television debut in 2018 as a BBC Young Musician piano finalist. Through his unique artistry, coupled with an innate public appeal and flair for communication, he has become a leading ambassador for classical music across the UK and abroad.

Born in Hong Kong, Adam commands a demanding schedule of nternational engagements, featuring performances at distinguished venues such as the Southbank Centre and Royal Albert Hall in London, the International Center for Arts in Cairo, and the National Center for the Performing Arts in Mumbai. He has performed alongside eminent musicians such as double-bassist Chi-chi Nwanoku OBE, soprano Francesca Chiejina, and cellist Laura van der Heijden, as well as with high-ranking conductors including David Curtis, Ionathon Heyward, and Pete Harrison.

A laureate of the Stefano Marizza International Piano Competition in Italy and the International Piano Competition HRH Princess Lalla Meryem in Morocco, Adam studied with Christopher Elton at the Royal Academy of Music in London. Generously supported by Irish Heritage, The Keyboard Charitable Trust, and The Talent Unlimited Foundation, he currently studies privately with Penelope Roskell.

Yassine Taoudi-Benchekroun

Born in Casablanca, Moroccan conductor Yassine studied as a pianist under the auspices of the prestigious École



Normale Alfred Cortot with Nicole Salmon, as well as undertaking private tuition with Yulia Stroy and Kenza Chakir. Upon arriving in the United Kingdom, Yassine pursued a degree in Biomedical Engineering at King's College London, where he cultivated a deep love for orchestral music.

It was during these years that orchestral conducting became his principal focus, and he has since studied with illustrious artists such as Alissa Firsova, Denise Ham, Toby Purser, John Longstaff, and Rodolfo Saglimbeni. In this regard, Yassine has participated in numerous eminent masterclasses, and has appeared at venues including St Mary-at-Hill in the City of London.

Yassine is currently based in Switzerland, where he is pursuing a Masters degree in Neural Systems & Computation at ETH Zurich.

Madeleine Dawson is a violinist doing her Masters at The Guildhall School of Music and Drama, following an upper-second degree from the Royal College of Music. She is an experienced orchestral player, alongside involvement with chamber music which has her leading a string quartet, violin duo and a piano quintet.

Eliza is a violinist based in London. Alongside performing, she is passionate about community music and education, giving musical workshops for school-age children and teaching privately. She currently works with 'The Happy Music Project' who aim to make live music accessible to all including people struggling with their mental health.

Paris Rizas Pintzopoulos is a third year B.Mus (Hons) Performance student at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music & Dance, studying violin performance with professor Simon Smith. His studies were generously supported by the Stravros Niarchos Foundation Scholarship, the Trinity College London Scholarship and The Henry Wood Accommodation Trust Fund.

William Rolt

William Rolt is a violinist pursuing a B.Mus at Trinity Laban under Michael Bochmann MBE. As a chamber musician, he has performed in Wigmore Hall and Durham Town Hall; his keen interest in contemporary music has led to him leading the Orchestra of Trinity Laban's Apollo Consort Contemporary Music Society.

Nati Russo

Natalie completed a languages degree from UCL in 2020, then returned - a recapitulation - to her times of performing fiddle tunes as a child: she busks, from folk to film soundtracks, and plays in Irish music evening sessions. She draws from her experiences at London's CYM and in the LSSO, 2011-16.

Hannah Teasdale

Hannah Teasdale, 24, graduated from the Royal Academy of Music with a 1st Class(Hons) degree where she studied with Juan-Miguel Hernandez and Jim Sleigh. As an orchestral musician she has performed with the LPO at the Royal Festival Hall and in March 2022 she toured with the RPO. She has performed the major viola concertos and Mozart Sinfonia Concertante alongside Julia Bishop. Hannah has attended several prestigious festivals, including receiving a scholarship to attend the Stellenbosch International Chamber Music Festival (2019), and has received coaching from Garfield lackson, Matthijs Broersma, Martyn Jackson and Angela Malsbury. Hannah plays on a viola made by Lyon-based luthier Lea Trombert (2018).

Lydia Elderfield

Lydia grew up in London and started playing the violin at the age of three, going on to learn the viola at a later stage. She has just finished her first of four years at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance, studying viola. A member of the London Schools Symphony Orchestra, she is the violist for the Orpheus Quartet, which she formed in collaboration with other musicians at Trinity Laban.

Ivan Illingworth

Ivan is currently studying at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance under head of strings Nic Pendlebury. He has been privileged to take part in Symphony Orchestra: String Ensemble: New Music Recording Sessions: Shapeshifter Orchestra and Side by Side Orchestras with Trinity Professors, Aurora Orchestra, Philharmonia and the Welsh National Opera. Outside of Trinity he has played with University of London Symphony Orchestra, Young Musicians' Symphony Orchestra, Canterbury Christchurch Symphony Orchestra and more in venues including Queen Elizabeth Hall, Stoller Hall, LSO St. Luke's and Menuhin Hall, with an upcoming performance with Trinity Laban Symphony Orchestra at Cadogan Hall.

Eddie Mead

Edward Mead attended the Yehudi Menuhin School, and is now a Hargreaves and Ball Scholar at RCM, where he studies with Richard Lester. Eddie has performed at venues including Wales Millennium Centre, Middle Temple Hall, King's Place and the Wimbledon Festival. In 2021, Eddie was joint principal cellist of NYOGB.

Harvey Gibbons

Harvey Gibbons studied Cello
Performance, later Composition, at
JGSMD. While studying Mathematics
at KCL he was an key member of the
Modern Music Society. He has worked
with non-classical musicians such
as Pearl Fish and Cosmo Pyke. His
main area of interest is musical
improvisation on Piano, Cello
and other instruments.

Matthew Downey

Matthew Downey is a double bassist studying for an MA in Arts Administration at Goldsmiths. He recently graduated with a B.Mus from King's College London, where he received instrumental tuition from the Royal Academy of Music. He also played with YMSO between 2018-2020, where he received coaching from Paul Sherman.
