Biographical Notes

Since forming in 2021, the Heliconia Duo has developed a folk and classical music repertoire, ranging from South American choro and Argentinian tango to Romanian, Macedonian and North American folk tunes. They have performed in various London concert series and venues including St Mark's Hamilton Terrace, Beckenham Parish Church and Morden College Blackheath, as well as for Blockley Chamber Concerts in the Cotswolds.



Catriona Bourne

Catriona is studying postgraduate flute performance at Trinity Laban, supported by a variety of awards and the Women's Careers Foundation. She plays the harp and is a Choral Scholar with the Old Royal Naval College Chapel Choir.

At school, Catriona was a Rotary Young Musician of the Year Competition UK finalist, performing for Queen Elizabeth II and Princess Alexandra. Catriona read Music at University College, Oxford, and was a Choral Scholar and Ensemble Isis Scholar. She attained a PGCE and Masters in Music Education at Magdalene College, Cambridge, receiving a University Instrumental Award and Lincoln & Garrett Awards from her College.

Catriona performed as a concerto soloist with Cambridge University Symphony Orchestra in 2019 and as the soloist for a re-working of Saariaho's flute concerto with Cambridge University New Music Ensemble. Last year she won Trinity's

Harold Clarke Woodwind Competition and was a Highly Commended Young Artist at the 'Flutes in Tuscany' course in Italy; she was also a finalist in the Carne Trust Chamber Competition.

Julia is a German guitarist in the second year of her Masters degree at Trinity Laban. She grew up in Turkey and the USA, studying with Piotr Pakhomkin. She spent the first two years of her Bachelors degree at Berlin's Hanns Eisler Conservatoire, and then transferred to Trinity to study with Graham Devine in 2020.

Besides her solo and duo work, Julia also plays in a guitar trio. She won the prize for Best Interpretation at the 2018 Beatty Competition, and is the recipient of the 2021 Montagu Cleeve prize for guitar.

As a foil to her classical music-making, Julia also enjoys playing electric guitar in rock bands.
