



A few years ago I heard a remarkable 'Thought for the Day' contribution from the hymn-writer and theologian John Bell. He used the BBC Radio 4 broadcast to argue that – despite much popular opinion – Christmas is not just a time for children. On the contrary, he said, the Christmas stories in the Bible are populated almost exclusively (apart from the baby Jesus, of course!) by older people.

Joseph, for instance, is usually considered to be an older man – just as in the picture on the front of this leaflet. The shepherds, similarly, would have been adults rather than boys. What's more, the Three Kings or Wise Men certainly ought to be thought of as mature in a culture where wisdom was considered to come with age.

It's also worth remembering that the biblical accounts of the birth of Jesus are bookended between episodes featuring senior citizens. First, there's Zechariah, a retired priest and his wife Elizabeth who, in their twilight years, become the parents of John the Baptist. Then there's Simeon and Anna, two aged and devout believers who were eagerly awaiting the birth of the Messiah. All in all, we could say that although the Christmas story has an infant at its heart, it's also the story of older people being caught-up in, and in a sense enabling, a never-before-seen and world-changing event to take place. John Bell puts it like this:

'So if you once were a shepherd or an angel or even the hind legs of the donkey, don't let Christmas simply be a time for regression therapy ... particularly when now as always, God is looking for older people to be the midwives of the new things that need to happen.'
