Biographies

Catriona Bourne

Catriona is studying postgraduate flute performance at Trinity Laban, supported by Bibby Award and Michael Hirst Award Scholarships, the Colin Blythe Award and the Women's Careers Foundation. She also plays the harp and is a Scholar with the Old Royal Naval College Chapel Choir.



Catriona was a Rotary Young Musician of the Year Competition finalist, performing for the late Queen Elizabeth II. She later read Music at University College, Oxford, and was a Choral Scholar and Ensemble Isis Scholar. She attained a PGCE and Masters in Music Education at Magdalene College, Cambridge, receiving a University Instrumental Award and Lincoln & Garrett Awards from her College. Catriona also performed as a concerto soloist with Cambridge University Symphony Orchestra in 2019 and as the soloist for a re-working of Saariaho's flute concerto with Cambridge University New Music Ensemble. In 2022 she won Trinity's Harold Clarke Woodwind Competition and was a Highly Commended Young Artist at the 'Flutes in Tuscany' course in Italy; she was also a finalist in the Carne Trust Chamber Competition and in the Trinity Soloists' Competition.

Fábio Fernandes

Fábio is a young Portuguese classical guitarist and lutenist. He began guitar studies aged 11 near his home town, Viana do Castelo, with Francisco Gomes.



Since then he has studied at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama, completing Bachelor and Masters degrees and taking up a Junior Fellowship in 2020/21.

In 2021 he won Second Prize in the 21st Ivor Mairants Guitar Award and Third Prize in the Concorso di Chitarra 'Gaetano Marzali'.

Fábio is a versatile and confident performer. Highlights include recitals at the Barbican Centre and St James's Piccadilly, as well as Mahler's 7th Symphony with the Guildhall Symphony Orchestra and a solo with the Orquestra Con Spirito in Portugal.

With scholarship help Fabio was able to access the acclaimed guitar programme Máster Guitarra Alicante in Spain this year. Fábio graduated 'cum laude'.

Fábio started playing the lute and theorbo in 2015. He has performed with AAM at the Deal Festival and at the London Handel Festival during the Guildhall Cantata Project.

Fábio is soon to release a debut album of English music - featuring long lost works, new commissions and arrangements.
